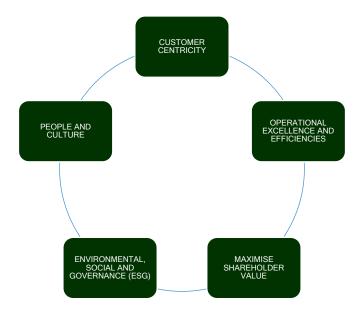

OPERATING ENVIRONMENT

Our macro-operating environment continues to be influenced by external and internal factors that are not always under our control. These factors include economic, regulatory and industry trends in Nigeria as well as supply chain disruptions the global conflicts that continues to impact our entire operating environment. This operating environment constantly informs and shapes our strategy as we adapt to these trends and navigate our way forward.



GLOBAL UNREST & POLICY CHANGES

IMPACT IN 2023

Local trading conditions remain challenging and have been compounded by global unrest and uncertainties coupled with change in foreign currency rate policy.

COMPANY INTERVENTIONS:

Cost optimization OUTLOOK:

The swift escalation in global food and energy costs, stemming from the Ukraine invasion, persistent high cost of inputs as well as continued naira depreciation, will impact company's trading outcomes. In light of this, it remains imperative that we steadfastly adhere to our energy conservation, fuel management, and cash preservation protocols.

ECONOMY

IMPACT IN 2023:

The Nigerian economy experienced slowed growth in the period under review. This slow growth performance was due to policy changes and other economic challenges. Consumers and businesses faced economic challenges compounded by global unrest and uncertainties. Real income remained under pressure as the country experienced a surge in inflation, coupled with a significant devaluation of the naira against the dollar, with more pressure on costs and income structure. The high inflation, particularly food and transportation inflation, has not abated. The total effect of removing the petrol subsidy and devaluing naira will continue to drive the inflation rate.

Nigeria's Gross Domestic Product (GDP) grew by 3.46% (year-on-year) in real terms in the fourth quarter of 2023. This growth rate is lower than the 3.52% recorded in the fourth quarter of 2022 and higher than the third quarter of 2023 growth of 2.54%. The performance of the GDP in the fourth quarter of 2023 was driven mainly by the services sector, which recorded an increase of 3.98% and contributed 56.55% to the aggregate GDP. The agriculture sector grew by 2.10%, from the growth of 2.05% recorded in the fourth quarter of 2022. The growth of the industrial sector was 3.86%, an improvement from -0.94% recorded in the fourth quarter of 2022. In terms of share of the GDP, the industrial and services sectors contributed more to the aggregate GDP in the fourth quarter of 2023 compared to the fourth quarter of 2022. On an annual basis, GDP grew by 2.74% in 2023 relative to 3.10% in 2022.

On a year-on-year basis, Nigeria's headline inflation rate was 7.58% points higher than the rate recorded in December 2022, which was 21.34%. This shows that the headline inflation rate (year-on-year basis) increased in December 2023 compared to the same month in the preceding year (i.e., December 2022).

COMPANY INTERVENTIONS:

Ongoing cost efficiencies and optimization and pricing.

OUTLOOK:

We are committed to ensuring the Company's profitability and applying solid strategies to compete on the price and quality of the hospitality services rendered to customers and maintain its property to the highest standard.

GAMING & HOSPITALITY INDUSTRY

IMPACT IN 2023:

Despite the myriad challenges faced, TCN achieved commendable performance and experienced notable growth, particularly with a remarkable 26% increase in hospitality revenues. Albeit, our gaming revenues were subdued with a reduction to last year. It's worth noting that the hospitality industry remains significantly influenced by the elevated travel costs and the constrained disposable income of consumers, stemming from financial uncertainty and various other socio-economic factors

COMPANY INTERVENTIONS:

- Implemented a new website booking engine.
- Continued Global Hotels Alliance participationworld's largest alliance of independent hotel brands network.
- Focus on local leisure in the absence of international travelers.

OUTLOOK:

Although economic challenges are expected to persist in the foreseeable future, the combination of soaring international air travel costs and the devaluation of the naira has constrained travel options. We continuously re-align our pricing strategy at commercially viable competitive pace to aid in value creation for stakeholders.

REGULATION

IMPACT IN 2023:

There were no major regulatory changes directly impacting operations during the year 2023.

COMPANY INTERVENTIONS:

OUTLOOK:

TCN continues to monitor regulatory developments, engage relevant regulatory bodies and mitigate relevant legislative risks.

All staff are members of an approved medical aid scheme. A daily meal is provided to staff while on duty. The Company is also very conscious of the safety requirements both of its guests and employees, and stringent precautions are taken to ensure this. It has a Health and Safety Committee (comprising management and staff), whose members receive regular training in the areas of health and safety.

FIRE. LIFE SAFETY AND RISK CONTROL AUDITS

External audits, conducted by relevant authorities, focused on assessing fire prevention and control measure effectiveness; fire equipment servicing, maintenance and repair interventions; legislative compliance; public health and safety, and emergency preparedness were conducted.

HYGIENE AUDITS

We pride ourselves on maintaining the highest foodsafety and hygiene standards and are HACCP certified. We monitor and mitigate all hygiene related risks focusing on food safety.

CORPORATE GOVERNANCE

The Company continues to subscribe to the highest principles of good corporate governance. An outline of the Company's current corporate governance structure and practices is provided below:

BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The directors are responsible for the corporate governance of the Company.

The affairs of the Company are structured for management by a board of directors. As at the date of this report the board consisted of eight directors. The board meets regularly to decide on policy matters and direct the affairs of the Company. During these meetings, the directors also review the Company's performance, operations and finances, and set standards for the ethical conduct of the Company's business.

AUDIT COMMITTEE

In accordance with Section 404(2) of the Companies and Allied Matters Act (CAMA) 2020 (as amended), the Company has an audit committee comprising two Company directors and three shareholder representatives. The audit committee carries out its functions as set out in section 404(7) of the Companies and Allied Matters Act (CAMA) 2020 (as amended) and according to its approved terms of reference.

PROCESS OF APPOINTMENT OF BOARD MEMBERS

The Company's nomination and governance committee ("committee") has the responsibility, per the Company's board charter, the committee's mandate and terms of reference and best corporate governance practices, to nominate members for appointment to the board. The Committee regularly reviews the structure, size, composition and commitment of the board members having regard to, among others, the Company's memorandum and articles of association, plus shareholders agreement and makes recommendations on any proposed changes to the board. The committee identifies suitable candidates to fill any vacancy that may arise on the board. The committee recommends these individuals to the board for board approval. Thereafter, the board recommends these individuals to shareholders for election or re-election, as the case may be, at each Annual General Meeting (AGM).

NOMINATION AND GOVERNANCE COMMITTEE

Evaluates the skills requirements of the board, committees and executive management.

- Evaluates the performance of the chairman, directors, board committees and its members, and the company secretary for recommendation to the board.
- Makes recommendations on board, committee and executive composition and succession planning.
- Considers the independence of directors

FINANCE AND RISK COMMITTEE

Reviews the adequacy, effectiveness and integrity of the Company's risk management and internal controls and assists the board to discharge its functions in terms of the management, insurance and reporting of risks.

The internal audit function is performed by the firm of Grant Thornton. A systematic, disciplined and risk-based approach is adopted to evaluate and improve the effectiveness of internal controls and governance processes in the areas that are audited quarterly.
